NOTE: Current law only requires licensed child care centers and group child care homes to report deaths and injuries that result in a child's admission to a hospital. Youth camps and licensed family child care homes are required to report all serious injuries, a child's admission to a hospital, and deaths.

Only those license-exempt providers who are subject to health & safety inspections are included above. As of December 2022, there was a total of 95 exempt programs receiving Care 4 Kids child care subsidy, with 606 enrolled children.

As of December 2022, there was a total licensed capacity for child care centers/group child care homes of 103,329 and for family child care homes there was a total licensed capacity of 16,190.
