NOTE: The law requires child care centers and group child care homes to report deaths and injuries to a child that result in the child's admission to the hospital. Effective October 16, 2024, such programs must also report injuries that result in a diagnosed fracture, diagnosed second- or third-degree burn, or diagnosed concussion. Youth camps and licensed family child care homes are required to report all serious injuries, a child's admission to a hospital, and deaths.

Only those license-exempt providers who are subject to health & safety inspections are included above.

As of December 2024, there was a total licensed capacity for child care centers/group child care homes of 104,312 and for family child care homes there was a total licensed capacity of 15,916.
